

# WomenNC Parallel event proposal for CSW64

## Beijing +25: Pivot Point for Intergenerational Activism

At this panel WomenNC presents an effective model of engaging and empowering youth to implement the Beijing Platform for Action at the local level using the framework of Cities for CEDAW. Our work focuses on bringing international imperatives for local consideration. Though alliances with universities and like-minded NGOs as well as with intergenerational collaboration, young adults provide specific and local research for effective direct advocacy as a solution for implementation of BPfA. We highlight the mentor-mentee relationship that undergirds this multi-generational program, including the engagement of our own Juanita Bryant, a life-long advocate for gender equity, who brings her 1995 Beijing Women's Conference experience to enhance our current activism.

Those who attend this parallel event will hear directly from millennials about their research and advocacy work that includes several specific areas of concern that relate to the 2030 Agenda including maternal and child, transgender and gender non-conforming, and oral healthcare, sex and reproductive education, and gender-based violence. Ours is a model for of research-based public policy advocacy and an illustration of successful intergenerational collaboration.

We achieve our mission of leading young adults in the elimination of injustice against women and girls by implementing a replicable program that requires the collaboration between young and old, the fusion of research and advocacy, and the application of lessons learned from our experiences at Beijing +5, +10, +20 with attention to the particular current local situation. With a cohort of 8 university scholars we bring a wealth of knowledge and experience to implement the Beijing Platform for Action.
